Summary of Action in the AY 2015/2016 Faculty Senate

The following items were acted upon by the Faculty Senate in AY 2011/2012:

In addition, the Committee did the following:

- Reviewed and took to the Faculty Senate Executive Committee a recommendation for a Graduation Requirement in Global Inquiry
- Approved the Area C Assessment Plan
- Convened a workgroup to create learning outcomes for the United States History, Constitution, and American Ideals Graduation Requirement.
 - 1. Discussed and reviewed draft outcomes
 - 2. Referred draft outcomes to wider campus consultation.
- Met with representative of the Writing and Reading Subcommittee on the plan to create outcomes and assessment for writing requirements (Basic Composition, College Composition II, and Writing Intensive).
 - 1. Asked the Writing and Reading Subcommittee to continue working on the creation of outcomes for writing requirements.
- Consulted with the Dean for Undergraduate Studies on matters pertaining to 2nd Baccalaureate Students and the GWAR.
- Discussed the intersection of General Education and the ongoing topic of Graduation Rates with the Executive Director for Student Success Initiatives.
- The Chair and Dean for Undergraduate Studies drafted a brief item on GE Assessment for the Meaning, Quality, and Integrity of the Degree group working on the WASC self-study.

Summary of anticipated action in AY 2016/2017 of the GE/GRPC

As Chair, I anticipate the following items will be discussed by the GE/GRPC in AY 2016/2017

- Bring back to the Senate Executive Committee requested data on a Graduation Requirement in Global Inquiry
- Recommendations for Senate action on: United States History, Constitution, and American Ideals Graduation Requirement Learning Outcomes.
- Complete the drafting of Area A Learning Outcomes and bringing those to the Faculty in spring 2017.
- Discussions of thematic General Education pathways (lower- and upper-division) General Education pathways.
- Convening in fall 2016 of the next workgroup to investigate Learning Outcomes for existing Graduation Requirements.
- Review of the current General Education assessment plan.
