The expected approved GE Area learning outcomes 13 need to be explicitly included in the course syllabus. Course syllabi will be 14 reviewed by the General Education Course Review Subcommittee. 15 -Assessment plans will need to meet the approval of the GE/Graduation 16 Requirements Policies Committee. The Campus Assessment Consultant, in 17 collaboration with the Director of General Education, will preview the plans and 18 make recommendations to the General Education/Graduation Requirements 19 Policy Committee. The Committee will approve or disapprove the proposed plans. 20 The Committee will also act as an appeal panel in the case of any disagreements 21 between departments and the Campus Assessment Consultant. 22 **Spring Semester** 23 • After approval by GE/GRPC, departments/course faculty (coordinator if multiple 24 sections) will implement the Assessment Plans. Departments will maintain yearly 25 records that include: 26 27 —Course and section information, and name of coordinator. 28 Assessment data 29 Reporting on Assessment: As part of the self-study/program review process, each department will prepare a General 30 Education Assessment Summary Report that will answer the following questions: 31 What information have you gleaned from implementing your General Education 32 33 assessment plan?
