INFORMATION

- Chairman Wade announced the results of the election for statewide senator as follows: Stoakley Swanson, statewide Academic Senator, 1984-87; Dorothy Sexter, alternate He then read a note of thanks from Senator Swanson who was unable to attend the meeting because of required attendance at a collective bargaining meeting in Los Angeles. [See Action Item AS 84-16.]
- Professor Goldsmith, of the Criminal Justice Department, 2. introduced local attorney Robert Earl Zawolkow who explained the background for bringing an action to enjoin any disbursement of the funds designated for exceptional merit service awards. He also distributed a form on which faculty members could indicate their willingness to be named as a plaintiff in such a suit.
- Chairman Wade distributed informational copies of a March 3. 30 memorandum from Executive Vice President Barkdull concerning the continuing problem of underenrollment in several departments and the need for retraining tenured He emphasized the necessity for all faculty to participate in the development of long-range solutions.

4. Chairman Wade announced that Acting President Gerber has scheduled a press conference to announce the adoption of scholarships for intercollegiate athletics. [See Action Items AS 83-17 and AS 83-18.]

*AS 84-15, Fisa, Ex. PROGRAM CHANGES--FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The CSUS Academic Senate recommends that:

- 1. The "Fiscal Impact Statement for Program Changes" (see Attachment A) be adopted.
- 2. The university require preparation of the Fiscal Impact Statement for all program changes.
- 3. In order to prepare the Fiscal Impact Statement for program changes involving academic units other than the unit proposing the change, the university require that the affected academic units be consulted.

AS 88-16, Flr. COMMENDATION - DOROTHY L. SEXTER

WHEREAS, Dorothy Sexter has represented California State University, Sacramento, as Statewide Academic Senator during the past nine years, and

- WHEREAS, During her years as Senator, she has kept always in mind the best interests of the faculty and students of the CSU, and
- WHEREAS, She has held numerous positions of responsibility on the Academic Senate of the CSU, serving as chair of the Faculty Affairs Committee and as a member of the Executive Committee, and
- WHEREAS, She has dedicated herself in particular to the cause of just treatment for minorities and for women, serving as the Affirmative Action Specialist for the Academic Senate, CSU, and
- WHEREAS, She has devoted time and energy to her Senate work far beyond what might reasonably have been expected of any faculty member; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the Academic Senate, CSUS, on behalf of the faculty, thank and commend Dorothy Sexter for her service to the University.

*AS 84-17, Flr. INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS - FUNDING

It was <u>moved</u> (Urone) and seconded that the Academic Senate adopt the following resolution:

- WHEREAS, faculty allocations to CSUS have been reduced by eleven positions for 1984-85; and
- WHEREAS, faculty have been asked to transfer to other departments in order to meet the problems deriving from this reduced allocation; and
- WHEREAS, at the same time, faculty allocations to athletics have been increased from the 11.2 positions recommended by the Academic Affairs Budget Committee to 14 positions; and
- WHEREAS, the Senate in its action item AS 83-07 supported University Planning Committee

guidelines for funding intercollegiate athletics; and

WHEREAS, in its action item AS 83-08 the Senate approved the Fiscal Affairs Committee's policy and procedures on the funding of intercollegiate athletics; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Academic Senate, CSUS, oppose the increase in positions allocated to athletics, and that the Senate urge the President to maintain the allocation recommended by the Academic Affairs Budget Committee.

AS 84-18, Flr. INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS - SCHOLARSHIPS

It was moved (Kelly) and seconded that:

In the interests of allocating the very scarce resources of the university in the most efficient way possible, the Academic Senate resolves that California State University, Sacramento not engage in athletic sholarships.

AS 84-19, Flr. FACULTY ALLOCATIONS

It was <u>moved</u> (Kelly) and seconded that the matter of faculty allocations, transfers, and possible retrenchment be sent to the Executive Committee for study and recommendation.
