Whereas, A principal function of the Computing,
Communications and Media Services (CCMS) unit of
California State University, Sacramento is to
support academic programs; and

Whereas, There has been an explosion in the use of technology in academic programs; and

Whereas, There is increasing faculty demand for access to and support for alternative instructional delivery and personal computing; and

Whereas, CCMS must establish priorities and curtail its activities in some areas due to budget reductions; be it therefore

Resolved: That the Academic Senate urge the President to advance the date for the program review for CCMS to 1993-94; and, be it further

Resolved: That the Academic Senate be consulted regarding appointments to the CCMS program review team; and be it further

Resolved: That a preponderance of review team members be drawn from computer and media users vs. computer technologists or media professionals; and be it further

Resolved: That the Academic Senate establish an ad hoc committee to identify issues pertaining to academic programs that should be addressed in the CCMS program review.

*AS 93-04/Ex. HONORARY DEGREES, COMMITTEE ON (amends PM 86-02)

The Academic Senate recommends the following amendments to PM 86-02 "Procedures for Awarding Honorary Degrees":

The membership of the Committee on Honorary Degrees be expanded to include two faculty at-large recommended by the Senate for appointment.

As part of the approval process for honorary degree candidates, following a recommendation by the Committee on Honorary Degrees the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate would be asked to consider and note to the President its endorsement or lack of endorsement of the recommended candidate(s). Deliberations regarding endorsements of candidates would be conducted in executive session and would be held confidential.

AS 93-05/Ex. RETENTION OF JUNIOR FACULTY, ad hoc COMMITTEE ON

The Academic Senate shall establish an ad hoc Committee on Retention of Junior Faculty charged to develop and recommend strategies for the retention of junior faculty. The membership shall include: Fred Baldini, Juanita Barrena, Jean-Pierre Bayard, Robin Carter, Charlotte Cook (Convenor), Robert Curry, Betty McEady-Gillead, Susan Meier, Paul Noble, Daniel Orey, Rhonda Rios Kravitz, and Mark Stoner.

*AS 93-06/IP, Ex. ADVISING FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The Academic Senate recommends adoption of the following:

Each academic department or program is encouraged to consider adopting a mechanism whereby a specific faculty member (or members) are assigned the primary responsibility of providing academic and professional advising to foreign students. Such advising would most usefully begin as soon as possible upon the student's arrival on campus.

A department or program choosing to adopt such a mechanism should send the name(s) of its faculty advisor(s) to the Coordinator of International Admissions in the International Admissions Office and to the Coordinator of International Students/Programs in the Office of International Programs. The Coordinator of International Admissions and the Coordinator of International Students/Programs will provide participating departments with the names of international

students majoring in that department and will inform students coming from abroad about who to seek out for departmental advising. It will be the student's responsibility to contact the advisor, but the department or program will have provided the opportunity for her/him to do so.

*AS 93-07/AP, Ex. GRADE APPEAL PROCEDURES, PUBLICIZING

The Academic Senate recommends that the CSUS Catalog include the same information on grade appeal procedures as the Class Schedule, i.e.:

The campus has a single grade appeal procedure available to students in all academic disciplines. Copies of the procedure are available in each academic department office and Office of the Dean of Students.
