Bachelor of Arts in History with a Single Subject Wavier: The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing has decreed that existing Single Subject Waiver Programs in History be phased out by January 1, 1998 (no new stdents have been admitted since January 1, 1995). Henceforth, all students who want to teach any of the Social Sciences in California's secondary schools must complete a subject matter preparation program that meets the state requirements for teaching all of the Social Sciences. The proposed waiver program meets the new CCTC's guidelines.
