Notes from the Chair: The first implementation of the policy on Instructional Priorities (IPP) took place in 2011-2012. The Faculty Senate reviewed the report/recommendations report provided by the SCIPP at its 2012-13 retreat and a workgroup was formed to determine what, if any, changes to the policy or implementation processes ought to be considered by the Senate. The workgroup produced a memo and a set of recommendations for the Senate's consideration, first at the 2013-14 retreat, and subsequently as a First Reading item on September 19. The Executive Committee requests that Senators review the materials, the proposed policy amendments, get some feedback from departments etc. in preparation for First Reading on September 19. <u>Notes from the Chair:</u> In 2007-8 the Faculty Senate approved a three year pilot (extended for two additional years) for Academic Program Review. At this point, almost all programs have experienced the pilot---providing a choice of review pathways with some common elements (external review, evidence based, recommendations to the Senate, etc.). In 2012-13, the Program Review Oversight Committee (PROC) recommended that the pilot be institutionalized and developed a policy and procedural manual which was approved by the Curriculum Policy

Committee, forwarded to the Executive Committee and brought forward to the Senate in May 2013. At that time the Senate requested adequate time to review the policy and the manual and to revisit the proposal in the Senate during the 2013-14 academic year. A first reading has been scheduled for October 17 and the Executive Committee requests members to review the pertinent materials with their departments prior to the Senate's first reading. The materials include the transmittal document with the context and rationale for the proposed changes, the APR policy and the pilot policy (the latter currently in place for this academic year), the proposed policy (very similar to the pilot) and the manual for implementation.
