2. Executive Committee Minutes: March 18, 2014

The minutes were approved as published.

3. From the Chair:

- 2014-15 Budget Call: The Chair noted that the Budget Call has not yet been issued, so incoming Standing Policy Committee Chairs should plan for status quo assigned time (4 units or the equivalent per academic year). She also noted that assigned time for the Standing Policy Committee Chairs for the 2014-15 AY will be increased to 3 units per semester for a total of 6 units of assigned time in the academic year. Furthermore, in acknowledgement of the work of the Chairs of the General Education Course Review Subcommittee and the Curriculum Subcommittee, assigned time for those Chairs will also be requested.
- Academic Resource Allocation Decision Making Task Force: Exec will review the charge of the Task Force at the April 8 meeting and determine next steps for convening the group.
