1. Approval of the Agenda: Approved

2. Executive Committee Minutes – October 22, 2013 Approved

- 3. **Sacramento Hall Security:** Iwasa addressed the new security measures for Sacramento Hall (*effective Nov 1, 2013*): The main entrance to the building will remain unlocked during normal business hours and a Public Service Officer is posted in the lobby. The side entrances will be accessible by electronic fob only. Iwasa will provide an update to the Senate at the Nov 14 meeting.
- 4. **Timely Adoption of Textbooks Update:** Repa provided an update on the implementation of the Timely Instructional Materials Policy for Accessibility and Affordability (*approved Feb 7, 2013*). Pounds and Parsons updated the Exec on adoption rates by department and commented on the cost of last minute book changes, noting its effect on the Bookstore in terms of buybacks and staff time for conversion of materials that are then not needed. Repa reported that Sacramento State is ahead of most of the other CSU campus for the timely adoption materials as the result of the Faculty Senate policy and the work of the Department Chairs.

The group discussed ways to improve the process including informing faculty of the financial effect of late changes. The group also discussed further refinement of the policy to do with guidelines to communicate changes and a more effective exception process

#### 5. From the Chair:

- Interested Party Preference Poll for Standing Policy Committees for Senators: The poll will be open from Oct 24 through Nov 6.
- <u>Livingston Lecture:</u> Dr. Sue Holl, Mechanical Engineering will be honored on Thurs, Nov 7, 3 pm, Redwood Room, Union. Exec was asked to invite students to the lecture.
- Student Housing Advisory Committee: A faculty representative needs to be identified to sit on committee. Beth Erickson (RTPA) and Corey Shanbrom (Mathematics/Statistics) will be contacted regarding serving on the committee. A call will go out to the Senate and the Deans if needed.

#### 6. From the Provost

• Faculty Hires: The Provost reported that the Deans have received permission to move forward with the faculty hiring process. He stated that diversifying the faculty is a team effort and encouraged colleagues to share the ads on the HR website with potential candidates. AVP Porter (HR) has communicated with Departments regarding the process and will be holding workshops, will attend the Deans/Dept. Chairs meeting, and will visit departments if needed. The Senate Office will share meeting schedules as provided by Human Resources.

7. **October 17 Meeting - Academic Program Review Resolution**: The Oct 31 agenda was reviewed and a discussion followed regarding reordering the Second Reading items based on the Senate discussions on Oct 17. A motion was made, seconded and carried to reorder the agenda as follows:
