- 9. NEW ITEM (from Chair): Adjustment to FPC meetings times, proposal of
 - FPC meeting times are scheduled such that they do not follow standard, class-meeting times. In fact, it overlaps with two standard, class-meeting times thereby requiring members to forego two prime-time teaching slots in order to serve. Considering the vital function of this Committee in shared governance on campus and the crucial importance of allowing as many faculty members who might be willing to serve, a slight shift in meeting times might



be beneficial for current and new members.

Questions to consider:

- Should we consider and propose a slight alteration of meetings times from 1-2.30pm to an adjacent standard, class-meeting time (1.30-2.45pm), so that faculty members would only need to block out one standard class-meeting time? CPC has already made a similar shift so it would not be setting a new precedent.
- Would the reduction of 15 minutes of meeting time create an undue or significant burden in accomplishing our work?
